



# National Indigenous Legal Advocacy Courses – Who can deliver the courses?

## 1. Trainers must obtain a licence

An organisation must obtain a licence from the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission (HREOC) in order to use, offer and deliver the National Indigenous Legal Advocacy Courses (NILAC).

## 2. Licensing process

HREOC has established a two-step process for approving NILAC training course providers:

**Step 1:** Submit the Intending Training Provider licence application to HREOC for consideration

**Step 2:** If approved, enter into a licensing agreement with HREOC to use, offer and deliver the courses.

The intending trainer must satisfy HREOC that they are equipped to deliver the courses in a culturally appropriate manner and in accordance with the requirements set out in the course Syllabus documents.

The trainer must demonstrate that they:

- are registered as a training organisation in their state or territory;
- have consulted with the local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Legal Service in their region about offering the courses; and
- have established an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Community Advisory Board, in accordance with the Syllabus requirements.

Additional requirements that must be met are set out in the licence application form.

A trainer who is granted a licence to deliver the courses will be required to sign a licensing agreement with HREOC. The licensing agreement sets out the conditions of the licence and reporting obligations to HREOC to be undertaken by the Intending Training Provider about the use and delivery of the courses
