I am a UAM.

I come from Pakistan. My city name is [REDACTED] I born in [REDACTED] My country and my region target for Taliban. There are many bomb blast and always big wars and terrible attacks. Shia people have arms, legs, noses, necked off, necks slashed plus there is rocket fire and missiles. This is because I am Muslim Shia. All this means no one is safe. And now because I escaped I am in Immigration Detention. I have been in Immigration Detention now for 11 months all together.

The worry of my life is not gone it is only getting worse. The tension the worry about my own life and the life of my mother and my 4 younger brothers and younger two sisters is eating me up.

Here on Nauru have nothing. The camp is too small 4 tents for 27 UAM's boys and all we can do is eating and drinking in one spot. No facilities, no internet, no mobile with other groups and. I am very isolated. I have insomnia I can't sleep. I worry all the time for my future. I have done no crime but. I am not prisoner. Anyone in this situation would understand how hard it is. The anguish is too much for my mental health.

I want freedom
I need freedom.

What is my future. I am seventeen
years old. I ~~don't~~ don't have ^{here} room
and I am UAM.

I want Freedom,
I need Freedom.

Please, consider my loss
of human rights. and how to look these
from me.
